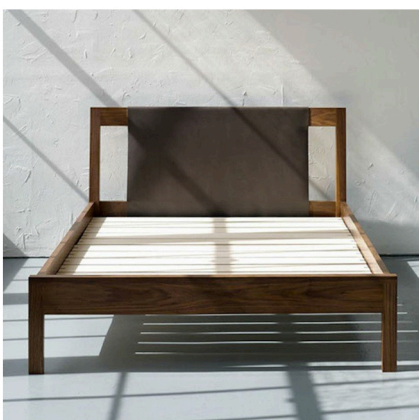
Recently spotted: Bedroom furniture by [Alice Tacheny Design](#), a small workshop committed to using quality domestic hardwoods, natural finishes, and responsible manufacturing practices.

Originally from St. Paul, Minnesota, Tacheny learned her craft during a post-college apprenticeship at a wood shop in Chicago, where she focused on joinery technique and small-scale production. Today, her company is based in the Bay Area and her designs can be found at [Erica Tanov](#) in Larkspur, California, and [Peace Industry](#) in San Francisco, as well as online at [2Modern](#) and [YLiving](#). Note: Most pieces are made to order and require four to twelve weeks for delivery.
